Graduate students interested in participating in research with Kinesiology faculty are encouraged to apply for a competitive Graduate Teaching Assistantship (GTA). GTAs are meant for students who are interested in preparing for teaching and research careers in higher education. The majority of GTAs are awarded to Ph.D. students; however Master's students are also eligible. Graduate Teaching Assistantships are available primarily in the exercise physiology area. These positions include teaching in the following areas: Strength Training and Functional Anatomy (KINS 1683); Exercise Physiology Labs (KINS 3601); Advanced Exercise Physiology Labs (KINS 4601); and Exercise Testing and Prescription Labs (KINS 4701). Assistantship positions are also available to assist in coordinating the undergraduate internship program.

GTA applications are accepted throughout the year; however, students are encouraged to apply as soon as possible to be considered for all vacancies. Please note that students must be admitted to the graduate program before they can be awarded a GTA position.
